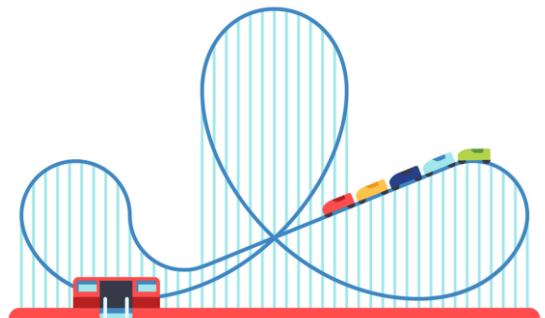

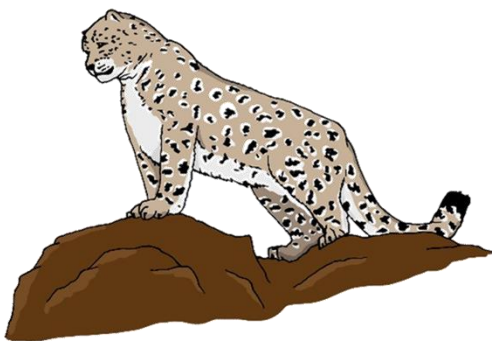

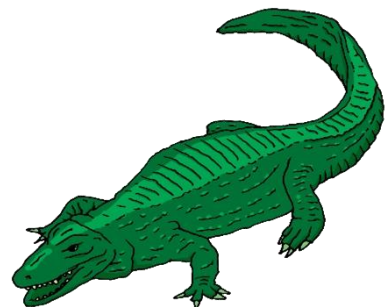

Application and Reasoning Using Noun Phrases

Developing

- 1a. Various answers, for example: Sentence B because the noun phrase gives more concise information about the village whereas sentence A uses adjectives with the same meaning.
- 2a. Various answers, for example: To convey how delicious the products it was selling were.
- 3a. Various answers, for example: The modern, glass-fronted skyscraper towered high above the other buildings that surrounded it.

Expected

- 4a. Various answers, for example: Sentence B because the noun phrase gives more precise information about the community.
- 5a. Various answers, for example: To convey a sense of fear.
- 6a. Various answers, for example: The adventurous, skilled climbers, who had travelled around the country climbing different mountains, began their ascent up their most dangerous climb yet.

Greater Depth

- 7a. Various answers, for example: Sentence A because this gives a much clearer idea of how the bath will be.
- 8a. Various answers, for example: 'Delicious' and 'home-made' convey the sense of familiarity and comfort.
- 9a. Various answers, for example: Waiting for the perfect moment, the stealthy, determined leopard gazed down the hill, ready to pounce on its vulnerable, unsuspecting prey.

Application and Reasoning Using Noun Phrases

Developing

- 1b. Various answers, for example: Sentence A because the noun phrase gives more concise information about the children whereas sentence B uses adjectives with the same meaning.
- 2b. Various answers, for example: To convey the meaning of how powerful and welcoming it was.
- 3b. Various answers, for example: The thrilling, newly-opened, rollercoaster ride, which had two different tracks, was the largest in the UK.

Expected

- 4b. Various answers, for example: Sentence B because the noun phrase gives more precise information about the leisure centre.
- 5b. Various answers, for example: To convey a sense of value or importance.
- 6b. Various answers, for example: Strides ahead of the other racers, the determined, energetic runner, who had been training for months, crossed the finish line in first place.

Greater Depth

- 7b. Various answers, for example: Sentence B because the description gives more information.
- 8b. Various answers, for example: 'Peaceful' and 'azure' convey the sense of perfection and beauty.
- 9b. Various answers, for example: Slow and steady, the cunning, greedy crocodile emerged from the shallow, marshy waters, hoping to track down something to eat.
