aspiration	A hope or ambition of achieving something.

resilience	The ability to withstand failures and carry on.
peaceful protest	The act of expressing disapproval through a statement or action without the use of violence.
civil rights	The rights of citizens to political and social freedom and equality.
suffragette	A member of an activist women's organisation who fought for the right to vote in public elections.
apartheid	An Afrikaans word meaning "separateness", or "the state of being apart".
segregation	The separation of groups of people in transport, education, housing and facilities.
discrimination	Treating one group more unfairly than another.
inequality	When something is not equal.

1955-1956	Montgomery Bus Boycott in America. Rosa Parks refuses to give up her seat.
1963	Nelson Mandela went on trial for fighting against apartheid in South Africa.
1963	Martin Luther King Jr's (MLK) 'I have a dream' speech.
1964	MLK's speech led the way for the American civil rights act.
1964	MLK received a Nobel Peace prize.
1970	Women's strike for equality in America.
1972	A wave of laws were passed to make it illegal to discriminate against women in the workplace.
